Sticky knowledge (learning that sticks):

- I can use my imagination to role play stories.

Physical Development:

- Has good coordination and balance when negotiating equipment and other people.
- Is able to tackle parts of a climbing frame, e.g. low climbing wall, steps, ladder.
- Uses bikes and scooters confidently.
- Uses brooms to brush and spades to dig in sand and soil.
- Can use scissors to make snips and cut lines, holding scissors in one hand.
- Can copy some recognisable letter shapes from name.
- Holds pencil in fingers rather than a whole hand grasp.
- Shows a preference for a dominant hand.
- Uses drawing equipment to draw a figure (this may be simply a circle with stick arms and legs).

Mathematics:

- Recites numbers past 5
- Counts a group of objects up to 5.
- Compares amounts using the language of 'more' or 'less'
- Reads numerals to 5 and matches to an amount.
- Orders numbers to 5.
- Extend, create and correct errors in repeating patterns.
- Understands positional language 'under', 'on top'.
- Compares objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.
- Beginning to use mathematical names for 2D shapes square/circle/rectangle etc.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development:

- Able to talk about feelings in simple terms, e.g. happy and sad, and give reasons if upset.
- Talk with others to solve conflicts.
- Confident to access the environment with minimal support and follows the rules as part of the new routine.
- Reliably toilet trained and just needs some reminders to wash hands and help with fastenings.
- Shows more confidence in new social situations.
- Can play with other children as part of a game or activity, without adult support.
- Can take turns and share sometimes with adult support.
- Makes new friends in the class, and talks to adults to share news or as part of an activity.

Expressive Art and Design:

- Uses a range of different techniques and variety of materials, e.g. paint, collage.
- Can cut continuously with scissors to make lines or snips and uses a paintbrush to form lines and circles.
- Uses drawing materials to create pictures with a range of lines and shapes.
- Experiments with a range of percussion instruments.
- Joins in with singing in a familiar group.
- Accesses role play and small world resources, sometimes playing with others to develop storylines.

Communication and Language:

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens.
- Understands and follows two-part instructions
- Understands 'why' questions.
- Knows many rhymes, songs, and talks about familiar books.
- Contributes sensible comments to discussions and conversations.
- Engages in conversation with adults and peers.
- Uses plurals and some tenses correctly.

Literacy:

- Understand that print has meaning
- Understand that the English language is read from left to right
- Engage in conversations about stories that have been read using new vocabulary
- Understand that fictional stories have a character and setting.
- Engage in phonological awareness games such as counting syllables, spotting rhymes or matching words with the same initial sound.
- Identify some significant letters such as the first letter of their name.
- Give meaning to marks they make
- Begin to write their name

Understanding the World:

- Talks about changes they observe.
- Begin to make sense of their own life story and their family's history.
- Begin to talk about similarities and differences between themselves and others
- Explores the natural world using all senses in hands-on exploration.
- Talks about what they see, using a wide range of vocabulary.
- Shows care for living things.
