Children will be following the Master Reader process to develop their reading comprehension and fluency.

THIS TERM'S MAIN TEXT WILL BE:

Harriet's Hare

WRITING

As part of our **Talk 4 Writing**, we will be learning how to create a warning tale using the book 'Harriet's Hare'.

We will be learning how to describe a setting and how to engage the reader by using interesting language choices.

MATHS

As mathematicians, the children will be learning about place value. They will be partitioning and comparing numbers to 1,000. They will be able to identify the value of a digit and order numbers to 1,000.

They will also be learning the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

SCIENCE

What are rocks, soils and fossils and how are they formed?

As scientists, the children will be investigating rocks, soils and fossils. They will learn about the properties of different types of rocks and how to classify them.

They will learn how these natural materials are formed and study the famous, British paleontologist Mary Anning.

HISTORY

As historians the children will be studying prehistory in Britain and learning about the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. They will visit Butser Ancient Farm and experience what life was like for humans in the Iron Age.

They will learn about Stone Age tools and how bronze and iron changed the lives of early Britons.

PE & BSL

In netball the children will be learning to run, jump, catch and throw in isolation and in combination. In dance the children will create, learn and perform their own routines set to a stimulus.

The focus for this term is greetings and finger spelling.

ART

In art the children will be creating their own wallpaper designs and use repeating patterns. The children will use the medium of sketching to do so and will look at the artists Abigail Edwards and William Morris.

RE & PSHE

In RE the children will be looking at why the bible is a special book to Christians and looking at the bible as one big story. In PSHE we will be looking at what makes a good friendship and how to resolve friendship conflicts. We also look at stereotyping and respecting our differences.

COMPUTING & MUSIC

In computing children will be learning about computing systems and networks.

In Music children will be developing singing technique. This will be done through the lens of Vikings and their battle songs.
